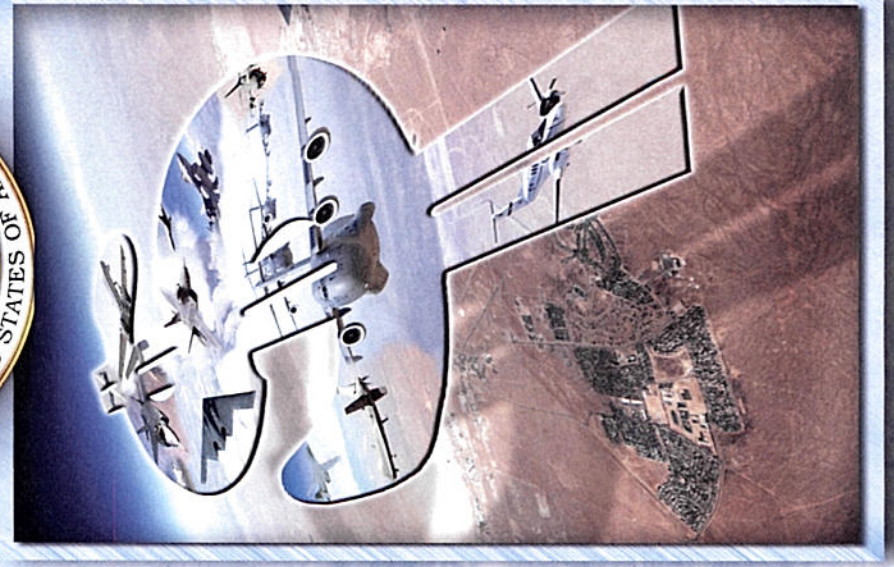

Edwards Air Force Base Economic Impact Analysis Fiscal Year 2012



FY 2012 EIA SUMMARY:

Edwards AFB had an economic impact on the local area in FY 2012 estimated at \$1.5 billion. The base's annual payroll was approximately \$653.7 million, its expenditures totaled approximately \$214.5 million, and it added approximately 12,451 indirect jobs to the area, valued at approximately \$655.4 million per year.

This analysis presents the most current information about Edwards AFB organizations, force structure, capital assets, and other aspects of the base. It aids Air Force planners in the allocation of resources and serves as a guide for community leaders, legislators, and installation visitors to better articulate the fiscal impact of Edwards AFB on the Antelope Valley.

Edwards identifies its primary area of economic influence as a 75-mile radius surrounding the base, and is comprised of those communities that house the majority of Edward's employees.

Edwards AFB sits at the convergence of three counties – Los Angeles, Kern and San Bernardino – and most base workers live in Lancaster and Palmdale within L.A. County; Rosamond, Edwards AFB, California City and Tehachapi in Kern County; and Victorville in San Bernardino County. Other population centers affected by this EIA include North Edwards, Boron, Mojave, Quartz Hill, Acton, Little Rock, and Santa Clarita.

Driving distances to Edwards AFB are farther for commuters when compared to many other government installations yet this does not even fully capture the distances they travel from areas including Kern and San Bernardino counties, Los Angeles and L.A. suburbs, Bakersfield, and the greater San Bernardino area.
